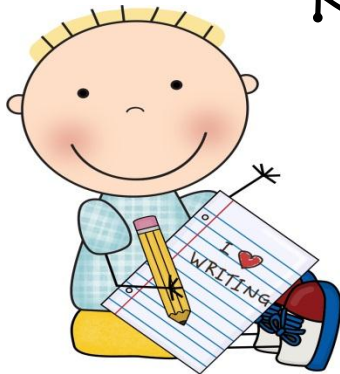

Teacher Notes

- I created this little poster and graphic organizer as a way to help simplify character traits for your students, while actually helping them think more in depth about a character. Often it's easy for them to say a character is nice or mean, etc. I found breaking it down having the students really look into the things the characters say and do help them to delve deeper into finding more in depth character traits.
- The poster is an easy visual to show them to help them remember to think about both what the character says and does when looking for a character trait. I even have students relate this to real life, by thinking about themselves or someone they know when thinking about finding character traits. This is also a great way to also mention inferencing because they have to infer from the characters words and actions a character trait.
- The graphic organizer chart can be used with any story. The students use it to provide evidence of a characters words and actions to support the character traits they use to describe the characters. You can also use this chart to review or teach synonyms and antonyms by having the students look for synonyms and antonyms of the character traits.
- I also included a quick activity that can help you differentiate this lesson. For you more advanced students give them the character development sheet to have them develop a character and write a story using chosen character traits!
- I hope this little set can help support your character trait lessons!

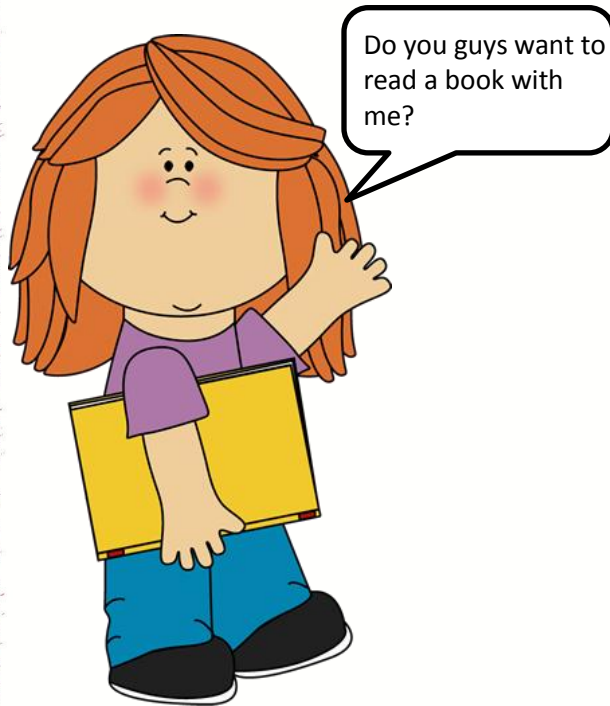
